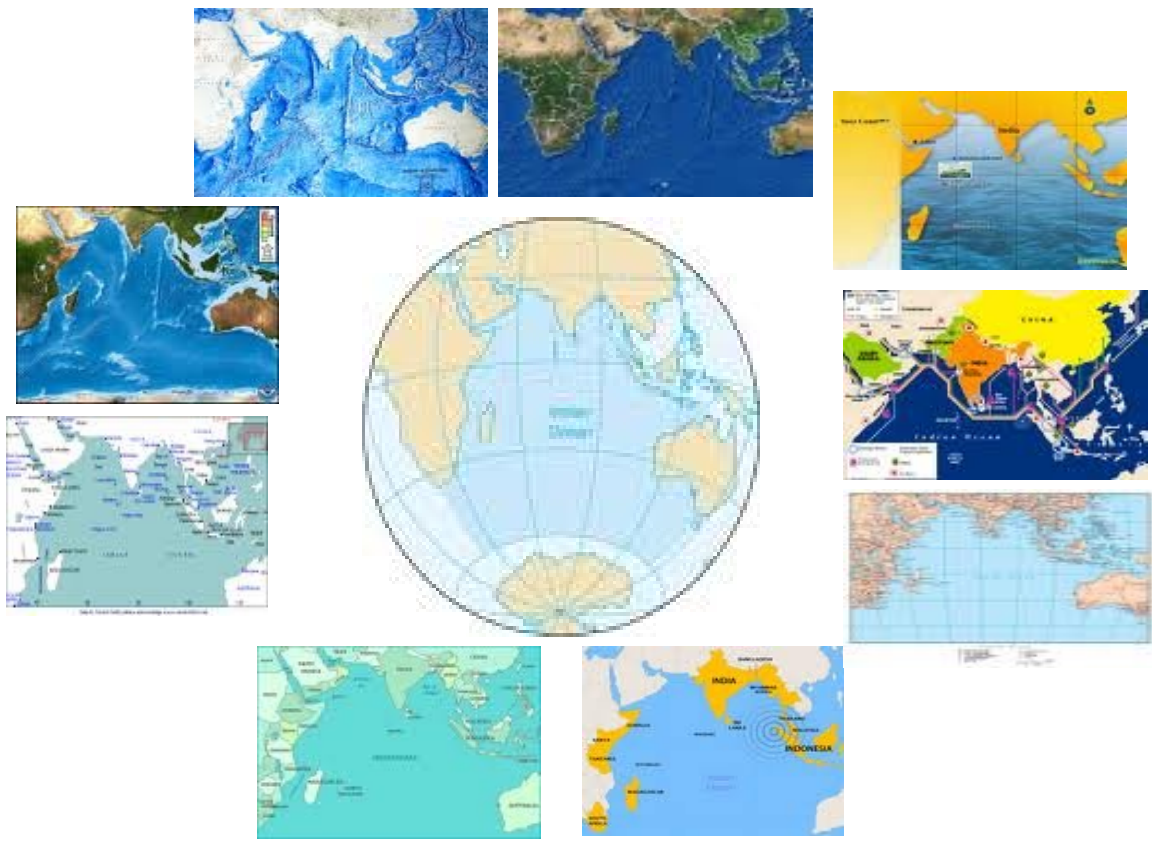

Fortify Andaman base to deter China

With more than a billion people to support and sapped of natural resources including oil, India should understand the importance of the dual benefits of strengthening our military in the oceans. In this context, the strategic position of Andaman Islands will not only keep China in check, but also enable India to explore the sea's economic zones for oil and metal hydrate deposits, said geopolitics expert S.V. Seshagiri Rao.

Delivering a lecture at Osmania University, Mr Rao brought to attention China's continued interest in setting bases in our seas, with naval bases built in Hambanthota, Sri Lanka, Chittagong in Bangladesh and Gwader in Pakistan, watching India from all three sides.

"Andaman and Nicobar Islands, spanning 1,000 km away from Indian mainland, situated 7,702 km from north to south, holds strategic importance in world trade," said Mr Rao, former head, mathematics and geophysics, OU.

"China has asserted its presence by establishing the Sigt-Sino Intelligence Gathering Station in Burma-owned Andaman Islands, that continually monitors Indian air and sea movement, and keeps track of our defence establishments in Chandipur, Odisha and Isro, Sriharikota," he said.

"We need a stepped-up powerful naval command in Andaman, independent of control of the Eastern Naval Command, Vizag. This will also deter China from future adventures in our northern sea borders," Mr. Rao explained.

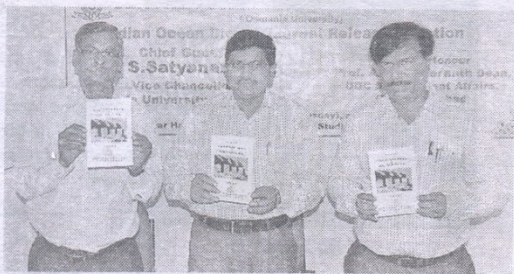
On the occasion an occasional paper titled "Impact of Global Warming on Indian Ocean Countries" written by Prof R SiddaGoud was also released by the VC.

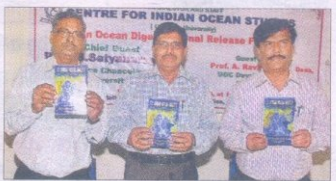

The UGC Centre for Indian Ocean Studies (CIOS) is the first government-funded research Centre in India, established by the U.G.C. in 1982 as the Area Studies Programme and upgraded in 1983 to the position of a full-fledged research centre - Centre for Urban Development and Regional Planning in the Countries of the Indian Ocean Region. This was conceived as a multi-disciplinary research institution including the subjects of – Economics, Geography, Political Science and Sociology. The thrust areas of Centre's research are urban and regional planning, resources-trade-regional co-operation, geo-politics and international relations, within and by the Indian Ocean littoral and island and landlocked states. With the increasing international focus and concern on energy and environment and climate change issues, these began to be included in the research interest and agenda of the Center.

UGC CIOS regularly conducts research on its thrust areas by way of major and minor projects, monographs, articles and consultancy. The bi-annual Indian Ocean Newsletter, initiated in 1986, was upgraded to the status of a bi-annual journal - **The Indian Ocean Digest**. Published uninterruptedly since 24 years, it solicits articles from experts on issues of concern to the Indian Ocean and its sub-regions.

The Centre periodically organizes invited lectures, panel discussions, workshops, seminars, conferences. Links with other relevant institutions are established to promote interaction and exchange of knowledge on Indian Ocean matters. UGC CIOS has a modest collection of books and periodicals related to its thrust areas. The Press Library of the UGC CIOS maintains a regular collection of clippings from leading Indian dailies on all the countries of the Indian Ocean region and related subjects, since 1984.

UGC CIOS is staffed by a Director and faculty members representing the four disciplines.

Objectives and Goals of the Centre:

- a. To promote awareness in India on the importance and relevance of Indian Ocean
- b. Documentation on Indian Ocean Region & Countries
- c. Research studies on issues of concern to India's national interests. (particular) and the Indian Ocean Region.
- d. Conduct national and international seminars and conferences panel discussions and lectures on Indian Ocean Subjects of concern to India's political and economic interests.
- e. Publish articles, monographs, occasional papers, journals and books on India's bilateral and multilateral relations with India Ocean littoral countries and regions.
- f. Undertake country studies on key Indian Ocean Countries relevant to India's national interests and produce country and issue based monographs.
- g. Compile primary and secondary documentation on individual littoral countries on India Ocean and its four regions, viz; Eastern & Southern Africa, Middle East, South Asia and Southeast Asia.

- h. Promote linkages and networking with appropriate research Centres in India and abroad
- i. In the promotion of the above objectives, UGC CIOS collaborated and synergized its programmes with Indian and foreign scholars. CIOS collaborated with the Indian research/funding agencies like IDSA; School of International Studies (JNU), RIS, Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), ICSSR, ICCR, Society for Indian Ocean Studies (SIOS) and AP Council for Higher Education. Foreign institutions with which CIOS collaborated in its research/seminar activities include: Malaysian Institute of Maritime Affairs (MIMA); Institute of Southeast Asian Studies (ISEAS); University of Malaya; Shanghai Institute of International Affairs; Finland University; University of Philippines; Vietnam Institute of International Affairs.

UGC CIOS's regular research activities include publication of a bi-annual journal, individual and collective projects, books, monographs, research papers, organization of seminars, discussions and guest lectures, extension of consultancy and invited lectures..
