**Concept Note** 

In the last two decades, writers across the globe have enriched the literary scene by dealing with contemporary themes and issues. Some of these writers are: Margaret Atwood, Peter Carey, David Malouf, J. M. Coetzee, Guntur Grass, Kazuo Ishiguro, Milan Kundera, Rohinton Mistry, Toni Morrison, Alice Walker, Ben Okri, V, S, Naipaul, Michael Ondaatje, Zadie Smith and Ngugi wa Thiong's o. Similarly, Indian English literature has registered a remarkable growth and many of its writers like Shashi Taroor, Chitra Divakaruni, Anitha Desai, Bharati Mukherjee, Amitav Ghosh, Vikram Seth, Salman Rushadie and Jhumpa Lahiri have achieved international recognition. The conference will examine the writings of all these novelists and assess to what extent these have contributed to the emergence of global literature.

Humanities/ Social Sciences

The conference is both comparative and interdisciplinary in character. Literature, as we all agree, is closely related to humanities and social sciences. Certain political and social movements have an all – pervading influence on common people as also on literary milieu. A writer is essentially the conscience bearer and moral watchman of his people. The conference will therefore discuss, apart from literature, subjects like Popular Culture, Human Rights, Feminism, Nationalism. Further, relationship between literature and history, politics and philosophy will also be explored. Papers are therefore invited from scholars in the disciplines of History, Political Sciences,

Philosophy and Psychology that fit within the larger framework of the theme of the conference.

### OUCIP

Osmania University Centre for International Programmes (OUCIP) came into existence in September 2006 after the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, handed over the management and administration of the American Studies Research Center (ASRC) to Osmania University. It is housed in the building complex of the ASRC and has inherited its academic and infrastructural strengths.
