Part A:

12. Starting of a separate cell for counseling of students

As the Deans of the faculties, Principals of the colleges, Heads and Chair persons of the departments are the torch bearers of different wings of the University administration, all of them have an important role to play in the successful implementation of the new initiatives. As there is a need to sensitize all the academic administrators about the CBCS and Grading system, and discuss about the challenges, procedures and modalities in its successful implementation w.e.f 2009-2010, IQAC of OU has organized two workshops, one for all the academic administrators and the second for all the teachers of the University.

Out Come Achieved

I. The University has introduced CBCS and Grading System successfully in all the PG Courses offered at the campus and Constituent colleges with effect from 2009-2010.

II. A five year Integrated Course in Chemistry has been introduced at one of the constituent colleges, Nizam College.

III. Online monitoring of Student Attendance/ course wise classes conducted in all the University colleges is taken up form this year.

IV. Central instrumentation facility of sophisticated equipments is developed in the Central facilities building to cater to the needs of all the faculty and Research Scholars.

V. Student seminars with a weightage of one credit are introduces both in III and IV semesters of all PG courses

VI. Project work has been introduced in all the PG courses from this year.

VII. Compulsory and Optional add on courses have been introduced for all PG students.

VIII. Eligibility Test was conducted for admissions into Ph.D. programme of various Departments to make it more transparent.

IX. The University has started a Centralized Counseling Centre named SAHAYAM, to counsel the post-graduate students. A specialist in counseling is already appointed for this purpose. Apart from counseling the students, the counselor would also train the mentors of the students to strengthen the mentoring system in the University.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

Introduction of CBCS and Grading System in all PG Courses

- A Post Graduate student has a choice of selecting two interdisciplinary courses/papers one each in III and IV semesters offered by other Departments/Faculties depending on his/her interest, needs and long term goals
- Continuous evaluation of the students in all the semesters is done through Internal Assessment Examinations, assignments, Seminars, Project Work etc.
- The student shall do a project work during the IV semester as a part of the regular course work
- Practical examinations are conducted at the end of each semester

- Course contents of each PG programme are designed to meet the ever changing requirements of the industry/job market/needs of society.
- The performance of a student in a semester is shown by Grade Point Average (GPA) and the combined performance of a student in all the four semesters of the PG programme is expressed as Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)
- Handouts of lectures and power point presentations of some important lectures are made available on the web sites of the departments
- Student seminars are made compulsory and credits are awarded for this.
- Course material is provided to all students under the Interdisciplinary and Add on courses.

- 5. Examination reforms implemented:

Some of the reforms implemented during last year and further strengthened this year include:

- Spot valuation was introduced for MBA & M.Com Courses on par with other UG and Professional Courses.
- Identity Cards were issued to all the evaluators at the Spot valuation Centre after proper verification.
- Identity Cards were issued to all the staff of the Examination Branch.
- Security arrangements were strengthened by deploying more security personnel at the proper points.
- Biometric system has been installed. All the staff while entering the office have to get their finger prints scanned into the system
- With out valid Entry Pass, outsiders are not being allowed inside the Examination Branch.
- A system of issuing documents such as Degree Certificates under Tatkal Scheme was introduced whereby the students can obtain these documents on urgent basis.
- Foolproof software is procured for Electronic Data Processing (EDP) system.

- The automation of Examination Branch is taken up at a cost of Rs.35.00 lakhs.
- Results and marks of the candidates are placed on University web site.
- Olive data information pertaining to the qualified students of professional courses is also available on university web site so as to facilitate the embassies to check the genuineness of the documents.
- A separate software package is developed to collect college wise and course wise student's information so that computerized hall tickets can be issued to the students so as to avoid impersonation cases it can also reduce a lot of manual work.
- It is proposed to automate the entry of marks by evaluators in award list to avoid human errors and also to reduce the delay in result processing.
- Bills and cheque section of the examination branch are brought under LAN.

The new collaborative programmes undertaken last year are being continued and strengthened further. They include:

(i) The Department of Zoology has entered into MoU with M/S Global Hospitals, Hyderabad.

Global Hospital at its Lakdi-ka-pul, Hyderabad, a DSIR recognized In-House R & D Center has expertise in conducting R&D studies in following areas:

- Stem Cell Lab Facility (Clean Room Facility)

Osmania University is having facilities for conducting research and animal based experiments, electro-physiology experiments and training leading to Degree, Post Graduation and Doctoral Programmes offered in the faculties of Science, Technology, Engineering, Informatics, Law and Management. The Zoology Department animal house facility will be utilized to conduct the proposed project. The Department would ensure the procurement of proposed animals and perform the bone-marrow aspiration, assess the integrity of the sample for volume and number of cells. The Department may choose to perform the initial work-up of isolation and culture of cells.

Global Hospital and Osmania University have agreed to collaborate in the following areas:

- Teaching, Research and Training in selected and advanced Thrust Areas in S & T.
- Intellectual Property Rights
- Consultancy Work
- University-Global Hospital joint research programmes under funding from out side agencies such as DST, DBT, DSIR, etc.
- Technology Management and Technology Transfer
- Any other areas of mutual interest
- Pertaining to the project, the Global Hospital would actively in collaboration with Zoology Department, up scale the isolated stem cells and performs the tasks of inducing them to islets and subsequent characterization by IHC and Flow Analysis will be performed.

The envisaged DST Project that is taken up under this MoU between Osmania University and Global Hospital is divided into three phases and the financial grant from DST is agreed to be shared by the two parties to this MoU at the ratio of 1:1.3 that is Rs.45 lakhs to the share of Osmania University and Rs.59 lakhs to the share of Global Hospital. The equipment acquired during this project by both theses institutions through the grant as cited becomes the property of the respective institutions with the consent of the DST.

(ii) Centre for Plant & Molecular Biology has entered into MoU with International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics, Hyderabad.

ICRISAT and Osmania University will cooperate so as to

i) Jointly explore, design and implement relevant research initiatives such as biotechnology, nano technology, engineering and analytical instrumentation; and extension projects specifically those that relates to outreach/demonstration through shared utilization of resources of both organizations.

ii) Strengthen the capacity of agricultural research institutions to develop technologies and to adopt technologies generated by ICRISAT, OU and other institutions through the consortium and partnership approach.

iii) Jointly promote and facilitate public-private partnerships through specific activities.

iv) Facilitate dissemination and sharing of information by conducting cosponsored seminars, conferences and workshops as necessary.

ICRISAT and OU, will enhance student degree training, and provide training and opportunities for postgraduate and doctoral thesis research.

i) OU will recognize ICRISAT as an institution for conducting research relating to the thesis requirements of the research students for the degrees. OU will recognize ICRISAT scientists on their individual merits in accordance with the University's rules and standards, for guiding research students working for Ph.D. degrees.

ii) All those desirous of registering as Ph.D. students must qualify at the eligibility test conducted by the University for admission . The course requirements for Ph.D. will be completed at OU. The research students who work for their Ph.D. degree shall have two supervisors, one advisor from OU and one co-advisor from ICRISAT. There may also be additional supervisors/committee members based on the requirements of OU.

iii) ICRISAT will provide facilities for field and laboratory work to the Ph.D. students admitted by OU to carry out their thesis research program. The number of students accepted will be based on ICRISAT scientist's agenda and time availability.

Programme Highlights of DBT:

- The released grants are being utilized to strengthen the recently introduced choice based credit system in various Life Science Departments based on CBCS (A choice based credit system, 14 core papers and 2 optional papers). The grants will facilitate M.Sc. students to undertake project work at the end of curriculum.
- State-of-the-art Central Instrumentation facility is been established for housing sophisticated modern instrumental facility catering to the needs of researchers.
- As the part of on going programme, recently 14 Research Scholars have been selected to work in various envisaged research projects. Further, two Scientific Officers have been recruited as support staff to operate and maintain instruments procured under this programme.
- ✤ Additionally 5 state-of-the-art modular labs with laboratory equipment are being established to conduct M.Sc. practical curriculum for the participating departments.
- The facilities that have been planned include Analytical, Cryogenic Storage, Genomics, Microbial, Plant and animal tissue culture and Proteomics setup. Once these facilities are established, they will help the post-graduate students in honing their skills and achieving academic excellence. Further periodic workshops are also being planned to train fresh graduates to improve their scientific temperament and employability.

27. Technology up gradation:

As a part of technology up gradation programme the University has established its own web server, mail server, database server and domain server. We have been procuring dedicated Internet bandwidth connectivity and recently the Tender Committee has recommended for procurement of 12 Mbps internet connectivity through M/s. Tata Teleservices Limited, Hyderabad for distribution to all the departments in the campus and also to all the constituent colleges of OU. We have also established Internet connectivity at Osmania University Center for International Placements and University Building Division. The University has evolved a centralized system for procurement of computers and its peripherals for all the colleges/departments including the constituent colleges of Osmania University.

Under the ERNET programme through INFLIBNET we are in receipt of 2 Mbps internet connectivity exclusively for subscription of e-journals for access to the faculty, research scholars, and students of our University. Many of the teachers, research scholars and students have expressed utmost satisfaction of the e-journals programme and are benefiting to a great extent. We have also hosted information pertaining to Research publications of the University teaching staff of various colleges/departments under "OU Research Publications' link.

Under Intranet services we are hosting information pertaining to OU Archives, Information of computers, Inspection Reports, University Committees, Tender notices (Rate Contract) of Administrative Building and other campus/constituent autonomous colleges like University College of Engineering, etc. We have successfully implemented on-line cheques printing in PF Section and also software for pension payment. In addition to issue of ID Cards to the entire staff of the University, the process for issue of ID cards to Hostel Boarders has been taken up.

The Directorate of Infrastructure had taken up a project for Campus Wide Networking and the Phase-I of the project is almost complete. The connectivity through Optic Fiber Cable has been extended throughout the campus to all the colleges/departments by installing Core Switches and Distribution Switches at specified places to meet the requirement of Internet access to all the departments for the benefit to students, research scholars and the faculty who can avail the internet and intranet facilities.

36. Activities of the Guidance and Counseling unit:

Sahayam, Osmania University Psychological Counseling Center was inaugurated by Honorable Vice Chancellor Prof. T. Tirupati Rao on 6th February 2010. This is an initiative put forth by the Vice Chancellor after recommendations were made by NAAC to set up psychological counseling services for the campus. Sahayam serves the university community and provides psychological counseling services, trainings and awareness programs on various issues related to positive mental health and wellbeing.

The services provided at Sahayam have included psychological counseling, psychoeducation, providing outreach services and educating the university community about management of psychological issues as needed.

<u>Psychological Counseling</u>: 60 students and staff have been provided individual counseling services for several sessions. The presenting concerns of the clients of Sahayam have included depression, anxiety, stress, relationship breakup, concentration problems, family problems, marital problems, anxiety related disorders, academic problems, problems related to negative thinking, fear of public speaking, poor self confidence, sleep problems, and suicidality. Students were seen for 30-45 minutes sessions typically once a week or twice a month. In addition, about 100 people who requested information have been provided the same regarding Sahayam and the available psychological counseling services in the community of Hyderabad and Secunderabad.

<u>Training of psychology students</u>: Students from the department of Psychology were provided training on suicide prevention and increasing awareness. They were trained to be "trainers" so as to be able to provide suicide prevention awareness programs to the university community. About 25 students from the psychology department participated in this training program.

<u>Suicide awareness training</u>: A suicide prevention training was conducted in three campus hostels on May 4th 2010 from 5 to 6 pm for 210 students. The trainings for students were conducted simultaneously by the students from the department of psychology and the staff of Sahayam. At Krishnaveni hostel, a student from MA I, conducted the training program alongside Prof. C. Beena. At Kaveri hostel, a student from the PG Diploma in Counseling program conducted the training program along with Dr. Diana Monteiro. At the Women's hostel, two, students from MA I, conducted the training, with Aarathi Selvan, Psychological Counselor from Sahayam. In addition, about 15 students of the psychology department were also present to offer support and help in the smooth conducting of the training sessions.

Student Advisory Council

All colleges/Departments have Student Advisory Councils with a faculty member heading it as a Student Advisor. The Student Advisory Council will consist of some nominated student-members representing all the classes. The student-members are nominated on the basis of their merit in their respective classes.

The Student Advisor will help students starting from the initial problems at the time of their entry to the career planning in due course. The Advisory Council offers help to students on a variety of issues and practical problems related to academic, administrative, disciplinary, personal, social or emotional. All the members of the Council shall work under a code of confidentiality. The counseling will be either at individual or group level on issues such as stress management, confidence building, creative expression, and many more as required from time to time. The council also arranges for workshops, presentations and some interactive sessions to help the students with job hunting procedures and provide more information about the opportunities. The council will arrange for the smooth flow of information from and to the administration and the department. The council shall also be responsible and work for the maintenance of cordial and harmonious relationship between the staff and students in the department/college.

Lady Counselor

Woman-faculty members are entrusted with the counseling responsibility for girl students at any time during the college hours. At least one counselor faculty will be available in the office to guide the students through the problems, if any. Counseling for girl students provides an opportunity to talk to some experienced and friendly lady faculty about some of their issues that crop up during their stay in the college

campus. The counselor allows them to focus on difficulties which may be interfering with their personal and academic development. It can also help them in understanding the situation and deal with their emotions and feelings. Counseling can also help them to manage and cope better with their problem and work towards possible solutions. Counseling is going to be offered in confidential manner. The girl students are advised to contact the counselor faculty members for further information and help.

All the colleges/Departments are provided with grievance boxes where the students can drop their grievances if any. The student's councilors shall monitor and attend to these grievances on weekly basis.

Mentoring System:

The University has introduced Mentoring System from this year. Each faculty member is allotted some students. The teachers arrange for meetings of the students allotted to them, once in fifteen days and discuss about the problems and advice them on all academic matters.

The "Employment and Guidance Bureau" of the university advises the students about careers to pursue. It also arranges meetings with entrepreneurs to explore placement opportunities for students. There are also Placement Officers in almost all the colleges.

Part C

PLANS OF OSMANIA UNIVERSITY FOR THE NEXT YEAR

Introduction of Semester System at Under Graduate Level

The University is contemplating to introduce Semester System at the Under-Graduate level from the academic year 2011-12 onwards. A Committee of Deans is appointed to workout the modalities for introduction of semester system at UG level. The long-term objective is to extend the choice-based credit system to the UG courses.

Strengthening of Autonomous Colleges

With a view to further strengthen the system of autonomy; the University has decided to grant autonomy to the PG courses in the existing autonomous colleges from the current academic year 2010-11 onwards.

Strengthening of continuous evaluation system of students

The university is planning to strengthen the continuous evaluation of the students by increasing the weightage of marks given for continuous evaluation from the present 20% to 30%. Further, measures such as seminars are introduced to enhance the quality of continuous evaluation.

Introduction of Project Report in all PG courses

It is made mandatory on the part of the student to submit a project at the end of IV Semester in all PG courses under the Choice Based Credit System from the current academic year 2010-11.

Introduction of Schools of Studies

To make the Choice Based Credit System already introduced by the University for Post-Graduate Students admitted into the University from the Academic year 2009-10 much more meaningful, the University is contemplating to organize the related Departments into various Schools of Studies such as School of Life Sciences, School of Earth Sciences, School of Physics, School of Chemistry, School of Humanities, School of Social Sciences, School of Management Studies etc. from the next academic year. Already the University has constituted a Committee of the Deans of various Faculties to work out the modalities for introducing the School Concept in the university.

Entrance Examination for Ph.D. Admissions

The University has finalized the guidelines for admissions into Ph.D. programme of various Departments of the University. These guidelines are prepared by a Committee of the Deans of various faculties keeping in view the UGC guidelines in this regard. The University has conducted eligibility test for admissions in to Ph.D. programme for the academic year 2009-10.

Strengthening of the Course work of Ph.D. programme

The University is in the process of further strengthening the course work of Ph.D. programme. It is further decided to make it mandatory for the scholars to present three seminars before the thesis is submitted.

Improvement of employability skills of students

The University is in the process of entering into MoU with the National Association of Software Companies for introduction of a programme known as Global Business Foundation Skills to improve the employability skills of the students pursuing final year of the UG programme.
