It is vital to social and economic development of the local population as it provides good and services.

Some of the activities related to access to biological resources by the researchers/scientists/universities/educational institutions need prior approval of the National Biodiversity Authority or the State Biodiversity Boards and any non-compliance of the act constitutes a cognizable and non-bailable offence. It is also mentioned that further details on the Act and Rules can be had from the National Biodiversity Authority website <a href="https://www.nbaindia.org">www.nbaindia.org</a>, and requested to ensure strict adherence to the provisions of the Act and to enforce the Rules and display the University's policy in this regard on its website and also requested to ensure strict compliance of the provisions by all researchers/scientists/teaching departments/affiliated colleges of university.
