But somehow, we could manage and make remarkable progress with the encouragement from Osmania University authorities. The success of the any research institution lies in organizing various programs related to the academic growth of the teachers at large and the scholars who are pursuing Pre-Doc's and Post-Doc's in the field of Humanities and Social Sciences. To make centre more vibrant and to reach far and wide we have organized many International and National seminars and conferences. Therefore many scholars visited the centre and many new life memberships, reader memberships and yearly memberships increased. Osmania University Center for International Programmes, a rich resource center for explorations in literature and International relations and policy, and Indian Society for Commonwealth Studies, New Delhi, have in collaboration organized this three day International Conference at Hyderabad. Four resource persons from abroad and about 160 participants from the various parts of the country have participated in the Conference.

Osmania University Centre for International Programme (OUCIP) organized the prestigious 2nd All India English Teachers' Conference under aegis of Association for English Studies of India at Hyderabad from 18th to 20th January, 2018. The first day of the conference began with the inaugural function which witnessed the presence of a good number of luminaries. With the invocation to goddess Saraswati and the lighting of the lamp amid a packed auditorium, the honourable Vice Chancellor of Osmania University Prof. S. Ramachandram was the chief guest of the function.

Prof. A. Karunaker, the local secretary of the conference welcomed the delegates from all the nooks and corners of India and Prof. B. Yadava Raju introduced the theme of the conference. AESI Chairman, Prof M R Verma highlighted the aims and objectives of AESI. Prof. S. Ramachandram focused on the importance of English language and the challenges it has to face in today's technological world. Prof. C.R. Vishweshwar Rao delivered his inaugural address to the packed hall and made the audience wonder at his oratorical acumen throughout.

Among the major events of the inaugural function was the release of AESI journal, Indian Journal of English Studies. While releasing the 55th volume of the journal, the Editor-in-Chief, Dr. Binod Mishra expressed his delight and despair about bringing out a journal in today's age. The inaugural function also included the award giving ceremony. Prof Amarnath Jha (L.N.M.U, Darbhanga) was conferred with the Lifetime Achievement Award of AESI for his long and distinguished career as an exemplary professor of English Literature. Dr. N. Nageswar Rao was awarded the senior delegate award and Dr. N.K. Ghosh (Agra) was awarded life time achievement award by OUCIP.

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The Osmania University Centre for International Programmes has a long and distinguished history of being the progenitor of the academic growth of scholars from the Humanities and the Social Sciences country-wide who have paid an annual pilgrimage to this seat of self-learning. It was most well known in its earlier avatar, as the American Studies Research Centre, not only as a rich repository of the latest books and journals but as a place vibrant with activity and visits by pilgrims resolute. Some of the most

distinguished scholars of the world sat in their cubicles at this Centre like the Chaucerian scholar in the cloister to work on their projects away from the din and bustle of the workaday world around them, and most illuminatingly interacted with the scholars who went up to them in awe to watch the spectacle of their unfolding their “corded bales” in their impromptu expositions on the topics the scholars raised before them. There were then the weekly scholars' seminar sessions where the scholars who worked on their Middle and other Awards made their presentations which were followed by discussions in which the topics were analyzed threadbare by the several visiting scholars and also teachers from the Hyderabad institutions who made the ASRC a place of their daily academic sojourn. This must have caused a certain discomfiture to the younger scholar initially, but when he discovered the inflow of infinite riches into the little room that the seminar hall was he felt enchanted and truly rewarded. The American Studies Research Centre was also known for the efficiency of its organizational structure and its readiness to meet the scholars' study needs. An atmosphere of collaboration and camaraderie pervaded the scene so that the scholar could enhance his academic productivity. A reflection on the experience and gain of the first visit compelled the scholar to visit the place again and again to profit from its ambiance and its vast storehouse of materials for study. One could hardly find another comparable academic haunt, for the ASRC was more than a mere library; it was a value imbued institution, a place of learning, collaboration and exchange. A similar place in the country to one's knowledge is the Indian Institute of Advanced Study, Rashtrapati Niwas, Shimla.

Osmania University made a magnificent gesture with a futuristic vision when it decided to take over the American Studies Research Centre, which in a sense belonged to it since it was carved out of its own space and is therefore part of its being, physical and

intellectual. Its contribution to the erstwhile American Studies Research Centre, in terms of the leadership it provided and the frequent colloquy its faculty held with the scholars there, is noteworthy and cannot be erased from public memory. But taking over a prestigious institution of this kind ought not to be an end by itself but a means to an end. The Osmania University Centre for International Programmes deserves to be recognized as a jewel in the crown of the University, especially in the post-centenary phase of its development when the University has been recognized by the UGC as an institution which could define and pursue its development with the autonomy it has earned through its splendid accomplishments. The concern ought to be on how to enrich the OUCIP and restore it to its old glory. An exclusive centenary grant for it from the UGC and special funding from the ICSSR and other national level and international funding agencies may have to be sought on a priority basis to make its acquisitions list up-to-date. How do we resuscitate the value of the place which was once a familiar haunt of scholars from across the SAARC countries? The OUCIP has a rich and enviable track record. It cannot simply be considered a place for the conduct of a few programmes or events, national and international. The OUCIP, in the fulfillment of its mandate, held several international conferences, and more recently the All India English Teachers' Conference, which over 500 delegates attended. Some of the books released at these events is revelatory of the debt of the authors to the OUCIP, a debt enshrined in the collective consciousness of the Humanities teachers because of the Centre's vast library resources, even as they exist now, which are no longer a matter for

pride because of the recurrent funds constraint. But at this stage the Centre cannot be left sadly neglected to a fossilized state. With higher education's accent on quality enhancement in every sphere of activity, long-term plans have to be drawn up to optimize this Centre's potential for contributing to value generation and the creation of a forum for scholarly communion in the Humanities and the Social Sciences. It must be borne in mind that this Centre is not simply one of "international programmes". It is a centre for capacity building in the areas of Humanities and Social Sciences and should be recognized as such in the context of Yash Pal's emphasis in his Report of the Committee to Advise on the Renovation and Rejuvenation of Higher Education on cross-pollination of ideas which this Centre is designed to fulfill. According to Yash Pal, "A university is a place where new ideas germinate, strike roots and grow tall and sturdy. It is a unique space, which covers the entire universe of knowledge. It is a place where creative minds converge, interact with each other and construct visions of new realities." The OUCIP should be so envisaged as to provide an integrated platform for building synergies among disciplines. Homi Bhabha, the postcolonial theorist, commented on the obscuration of the importance of Humanities and Social Sciences, which, according to him, share many common values concerned with communal well-being, public virtue, and ethical good. A sturdy commitment to the promotion of those disciplines is the need of the hour.

The library is the major asset of OUCIP. Spread over an area of nearly 25,000 square feet, the library consists of Periodicals Section, Reference Section, Stack Halls, and Special Collections. The library has inherited from the ASRC, one of the largest collections of books on American Studies. In recent years it has not only updated its holdings on American Studies, but added a number of books on newer areas of study and research. Today, the library collection comprises over 1,70,000 books 4000 reference sources, 2000 special volumes, 75 current journals, and back volumes of 350 national and international journals. Besides, the library has a collection of JSTOR, and of ProQuest Dissertations and Theses – Full text.

From 2015-2017 more than 18000 members used library from all over India. We have added more than 500 titles in these two years in our library. We welcome good donation in terms of books from our members and visitors. Our sincere thanks to Dr. Gillian Dooley, Honorary Research Fellow from Flinders University, Australia for her generous donation of books to our library. Library OPAC is 24/7 available online to all its viewers from any part of the world.

James Roach Fellowship in Pre-Doctoral American Studies Research

Objective

To encourage research in American Studies – especially International Relations, Political Science and other Social Sciences with relevance to Indian / American Relations.

Duration of the fellowship

One Month of independent study at the OUCIP library

Profile of the Fellowship

These are residential fellowships offered for one month during the summer vacation. The students will stay at OUCIP Guest House during the period of the fellowship and make use of the resources available at OUCIP library in the area chosen by them for study.

The applicant should be enrolled in a Ph. D., course of any recognized Indian university.
