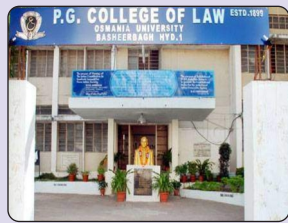
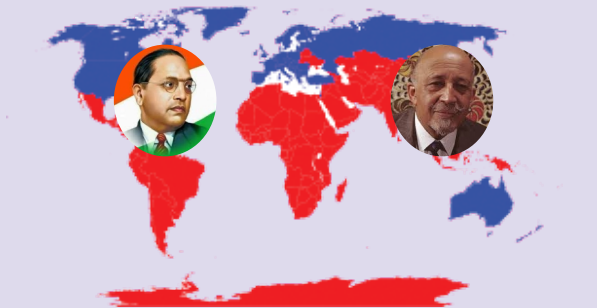

THEME OF THE CONFERENCE

Even in the comity of the so-called civilized nations, there has been discrimination geographical, social, cultural, political and also economic. Voices are raised in several parts of the world against the actual and perceived discrimination by different groups, which are demanding an egalitarian society. Often, it is said that there is lot of discrimination by North against the South.

The North is mostly correlated with the Western World and the First World along with much of the Second World, while the South largely corresponds with the Third World as Eastern World. The two groups are often defined in the terms of their differing levels of wealth, development, income, inequality, democracy, political and economic freedom as defined by the freedom indices. Nations in the North tend to be wealthier, less unequal and considered more democratic and to be developed countries. Southern States are generally poorer developing countries with younger and more fragile democracies, share a history of past colonialism by North States. The global South lacks appropriative technology, it has no political stability, the economies are disarticulated, and their foreign exchange earnings depend on primary product exports. Nevertheless, the divide between the North and South is increasingly challenged.

In economic terms as of the early 21st Century the North, with one quarter of the world population controls four-fifths of the income earned anywhere in the world. 90% of the manufacturing industries are owned by and located in the North. Inversely, the South with three-quarters of population, controls only one-fifth of the income. As nations become economically developed, they may become part of the North, regardless of geographical location. Similarly, any nation that does not qualify for developed status are in effect deemed to be part of South.

In India it is felt that, since 73 years of independence the regional part of South India is being suppressed by the successive Union Governments in all aspects. Same thing is happening in the World. Now it has become Socio-Economic and Political discrimination in U.S, U.K, Canada, European Union, Israel, Japan, Singapore, South Korea as well as New Zealand and in Taiwan. The Global South is made up of Africa, Latin American and developing Asian countries including the Middle East, and is home to BRICS countries and also in Indonesia.

It is imperative to discuss the discrimination between not only North-South in India but also at the global level.
