New Education Policy 2020 has been introduced after a long gap of thirtysix years, to review and revamp the entire educational structure in India, as per the global requirements of the future generations. The Multidisciplinary educational approach of NEP recommends study of non-conventional subjects such as Language, literature, music, dance or philosophy along with the main stream subjects such as sciences, mathematics or commerce. The Academic Credit Bank with a facility for accumulation, transfer and redemption of credits, Multiple Entry and Exit system, dual major degree programs from different institutions in collaboration provide the students with utmost flexibility regarding the choice of the courses and the study period.

As per the Postcolonial critique, Frantz Fanon analyses in *The Wretched of the Earth* that the colonizer gains control over the colonized by creating false notions about the inferiority of the native culture and superiority of the culture of the colonizer. These are the strategies followed by the colonizers from times immemorial to induce inferiority complex in the psyche of the colonized, so that they accept the culture and norms of the colonizer as superior and would look up to them for approval. This is the phenomenon that swept all the Commonwealth countries alike during the colonial rule of past few hundred years. Now almost all of them were out of this wrong influence and as famous Post colonialist Bill Ashcroft puts it in the “*Empire is Writing Back.*” Edward Said opposes this notion of “Eurocentric Universalism” in his book *Orientalism* and Questions the superiority of the Occident over the Orient. Gayatri Chakravorty Spivak analyses her position as a Third World Intellectual working in a First World Country, and how it affects her life in many ways.

Now it is high time that India comes out of this wrong influence of the false notions created by the colonized that it has no culture, no civilization, no literature and knowledge of any value. As the NEP 2020 proclaims an attempt should be made to regain its past glory with “a rootedness and pride in India, and its rich, diverse, ancient and modern culture and knowledge systems and traditions.” The introduction of NEP speaks about all the great scholars of ancient Indian Education system as follows:

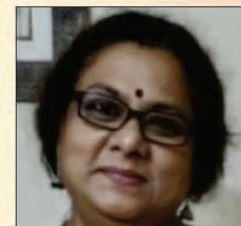

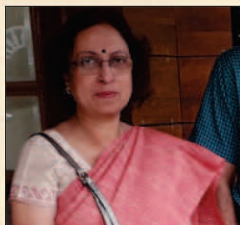
